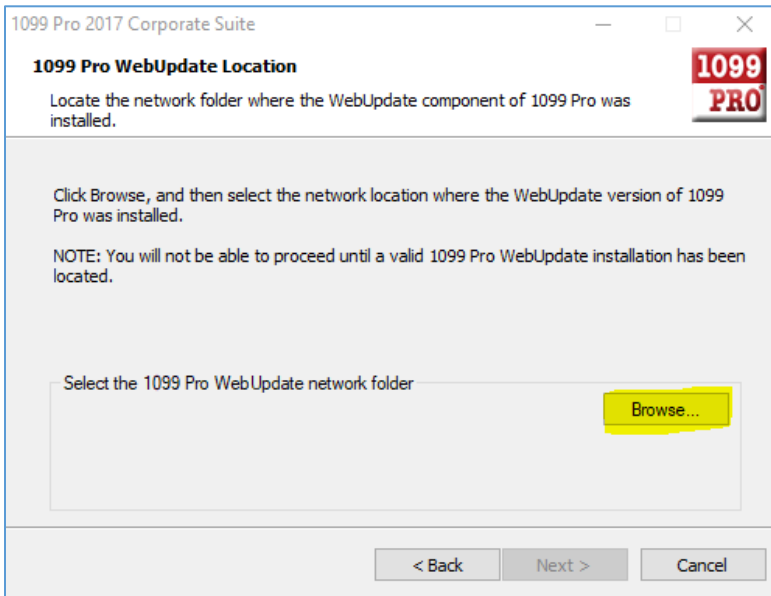
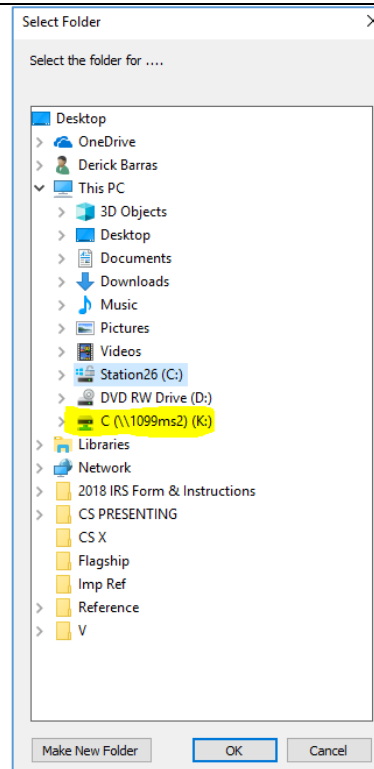
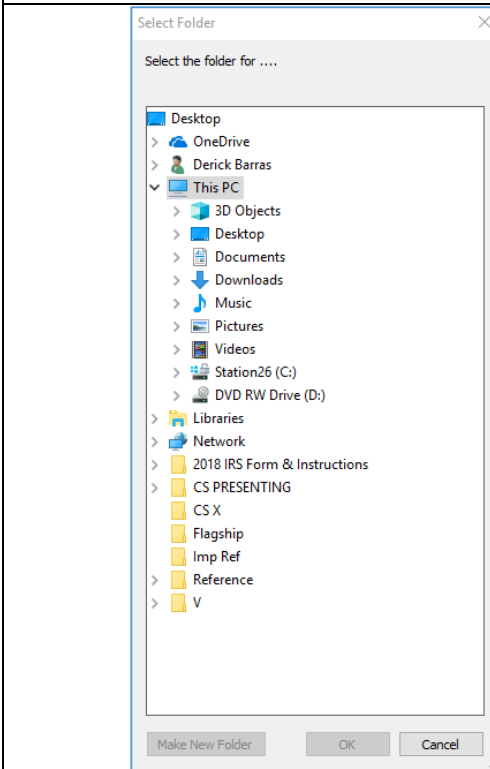


SUMMARY – Often times during a TPS Multi-User installation, or a Corporate Suite Client Workstation installation, a shared drive will not be visible and the UNC path is not available to enter. The below picture is an example of this.

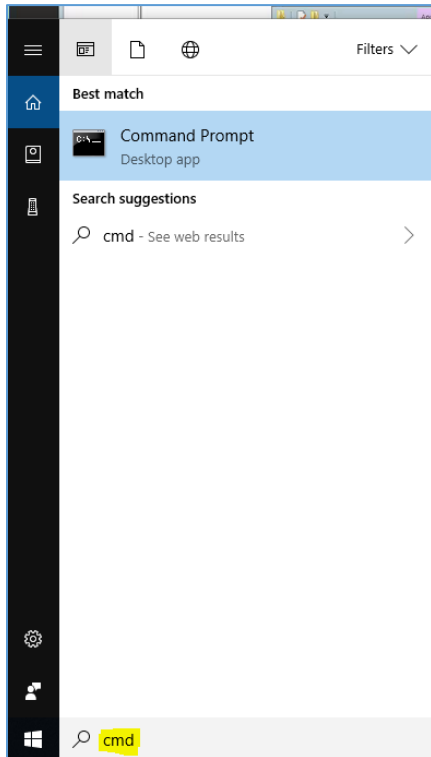


Sample screenshot of available folders when clicking the "Browse" button from the software installer. Notice the mapped/highlighted K: drive is missing.

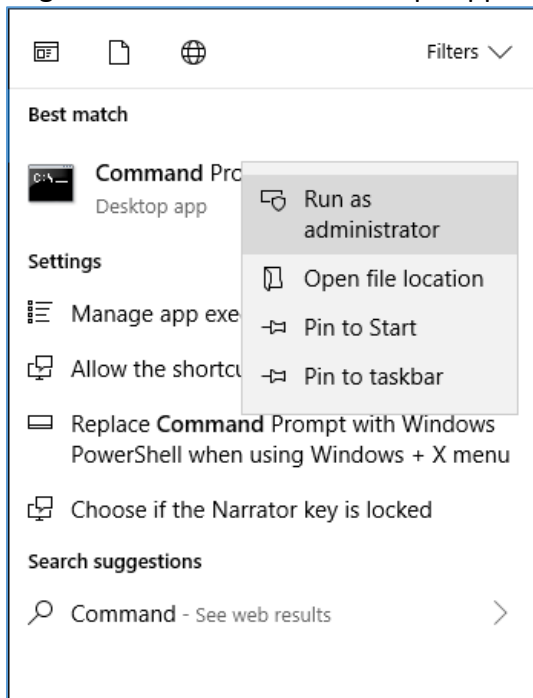
Sample screenshot of the user's available shared drives. Notice the K drive is present.



STEP 1: Go to your Taskbar Search and type in a search for **CMD**:



Step 2: Right click the Command Prompt App and **Run as Administrator**.



Step 3: Map the shared drive as an Administrator

- Sample Mapping – “Net use K: [\\Server\Share](#)”

```
C:\WINDOWS\system32>net use k: \\1099ms2\C

- K: - This is the drive letter name of the mapped drive that you wish to create
- [\\Server\Share](#) - This is the actual UNC path to the location being mapped
- The drive mapping will be successfully made in the elevated context of the Administrator.
- When running the software installer, right click on the installer and “Run as Administrator”.
- You will now see the drive mapping will be there when you browse.
